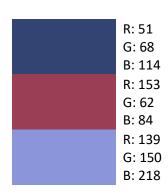


Criteria:

- Some designers may wish to include the pine trees in their ideas, although the trees are not compulsory



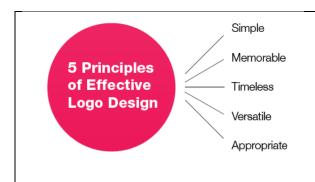
- Keep it simple
- It should be instantly recognised
- Ideally, it should look good in B&W or colour
- It should represent Crestwood HS



School Colours

What makes a good logo?

A good logo is distinctive, appropriate, practical, graphic and simple in form, and it conveys the owner's intended message. A concept or "meaning" is usually behind an effective logo, and it communicates the intended message.



An effective logo works across a variety of media and applications. Ask yourself, is your logo still effective if it is printed...

- In one colour?
- In reverse colour (i.e. light logo on dark background)?
- The size of a postage stamp?
- As large as a billboard?

Entry Conditions

- Submissions can either be a hand drawn sketch or a computer generated graphic
- The competition is open to students, staff and the wider school community
- You are allowed to submit more than one entry
- The judging will be completed by a committee.

Prize

A prize of a \$200 Castle Towers gift certificate or equivalent will be awarded to the winning entry
